
ABOUT THE MUSEUM

IRON HORSE DEPOT

The Iron Horse building holds a unique collection of early railroad memorabilia. Located west of the main museum building, the Iron Horse is housed in a replica of a Katy, (Missouri, Kansas and Texas) line depot, circa 1900. A locomotive, box cars, and a caboose are also on display in the area.

A section of the museum houses research materials including city and telephone directories as well as news clippings. Archives include items from Parsons High School and Parsons

SEE MODEL TRAINS

Located in the museum's rail yard, the restored Union Pacific Exercise Car houses model trains. The display also features a replica of downtown Parsons and photographs that reflect the city's railroad history.
